

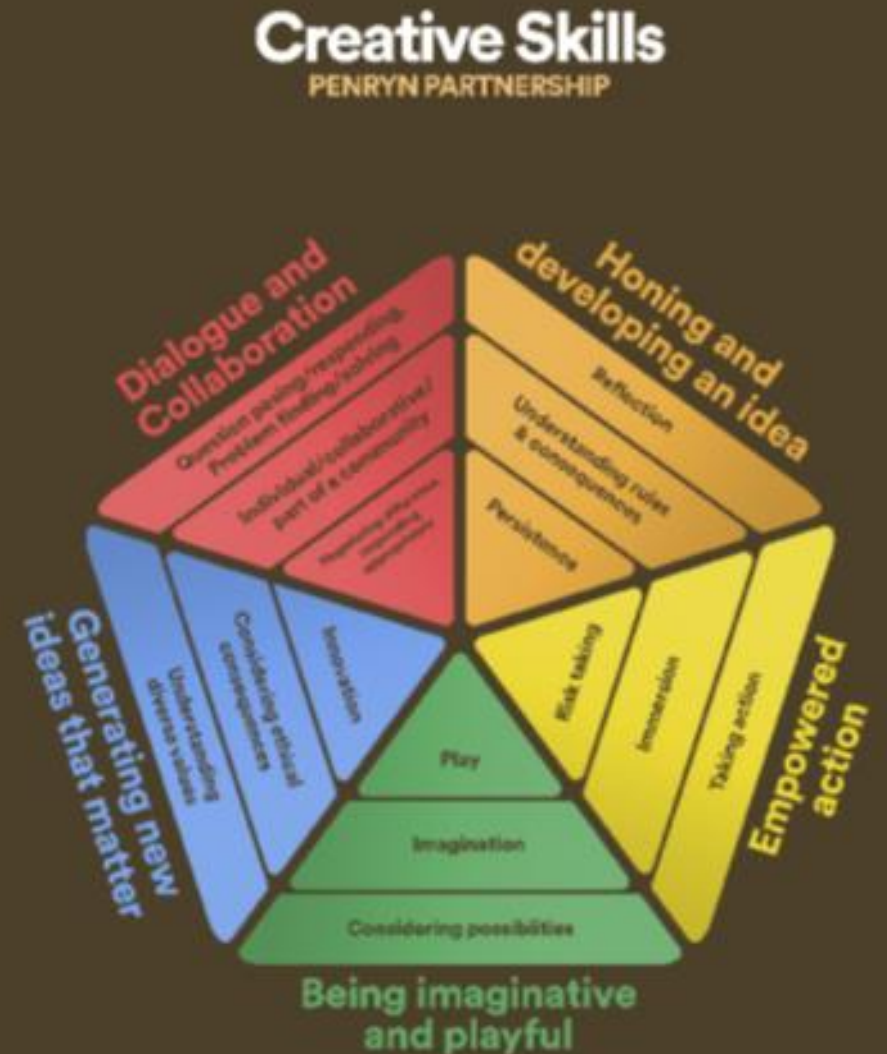


## CREATIVITY COLLABORATIVES PRIMARY STUDENTS
